Implementing ECVET in the field of health and social care

Implementing ECVET in the field of health and social care for the promotion of professional permeability and geographical mobility



Background

Due to demographic changes and an ageing society, hardly any other professional field has been more affected by the looming shortage of skilled workers than the field of health and social care.

The mobility of workers in the European Union can act against skilled labour shortage, especially in the Western European countries. Moreover, the European regulations on the free movement of workers are becoming more simplified and thus support professional mobility, especially for workers from Eastern Europe.

However, the comparability of different but similar professions in the field of health and social care is not sufficiently assured at European level.

At the same time, the European Credit System for Vocational Education and Training (ECVET) offers instruments and methodologies for the promotion of transparency, permeability, and mobility in the European labour and education market.

Objectives

The aim of the project is to support the recognition of learning outcomes of formal, non-formal, and informal learning in the field of health and social care on the basis of the ECVET instruments and principles.

In international cooperation of educational institutions from Germany, Belgium and Italy methods and instruments for the description, assessment, recognition, and transfer of learning outcomes will be developed. The project will support the mobility of skilled workers and help to close the gap between staff supply and demand in the field of health and social care.

Project Schedule



Project Outcomes

- Units of learning outcomes including ECVET points for nine professions in the field of health and social care from Germany, Belgium and Italy (amongst others: Geriatric Nurse, Health Care Assistant, Family Helper)
- Comparison of the learning outcomes on the basis of the examined professions for national permeability
- Common assessment standards on a competence-oriented basis
- Model for personalized transcripts of record according to the EUROPASS transparency instruments
- Development, transfer and implementation of extra-curricular qualifications for central professional competences on the basis of the learning outcomes of the examined professions

Methodologies for

- the description of activity-oriented and competence-based learning outcomes in units according to the recommendations for ECVET and EQF,
- the allocation of ECVET credits to units of learning outcomes and qualifications,
- the definition of common standards for the assessment of outcomes of formal, informal and non-formal learning and for
- the comparison of learning outcomes.
